ELITE 8 BRACKETS: The BODYARMOR Series is seeded and broken into Elite 8 brackets to ensure balance and quality competition. Schools are guaranteed two games - both games mean the same - and the team with the most wins advance. There are no ties **EVER** in the BODYARMOR Series, every game goes straight to state series PKs. The goal is to provide state-playoff experience for each game.

TEAM TIEBREAKERS: 1. Head-to-head; 2. The combined total of first-half goals scored in the two games; 3. Shutouts; 4. Goals against.

Why the No. 2 tiebreaker? We want teams to come out hard, no cares about second-half garbage goals to get goal differential and run up a score. Then after No. 2, we reward defense because it gets overlooked far too often.

We want the BODYARMOR Series to be unique, different and fun for kids.
